News from the Treasurer

Just as I prepare to step down as treasurer for the Fellowship (after 6 years!), I acquired and read the UUA manual for treasures. Guess I thought I know what I was doing all along!

One thing that was emphasized was that collections should not be counted by the same person who makes the deposit. This is just good accounting practice. It applies to cash donations, especially to Sunday pass-the-basket collections. So I prepared a summary slip of paper to accompany each Sunday's collection and have asked someone to count and write down the money, date and sign the slip. So far, so good; the deposits have thus far agreed with the money counts.

However, because many people put pledge checks in the basket, it's important that those checks remain anonymous, not easy when one's name is right there on the check! Therefore, unless I get to the basket in time, the confidentiality of your pledge could be compromised. If you heretofore have been placing checks in the collection basket, I suggest one of three tactics; give the Treasurer your check directly; put your check in an envelope and seal it before putting it into the basket (this can be an envelope from your junk mail, we'll assume it's a pledge payment); or mail your check to PO Box 103 Big Flats, NY 14814. The Postal Service needs your support! (Of course if you don't care whether other people see what you're giving, you can just ignore this advice.)

I have prepared some envelopes with the Fellowship's mailing address and will make them available in the display rack on Sundays.
