The fires currently sweeping across southern California have affected Unitarian Universalists (UUs) in many communities. In response to this disaster, the Pacific Southwest District (PSWD) of the UUA has begun the PSWD Fire Relief Fund. A district committee will disburse all funds collected to UU congregations, UUs in need, community groups in relationship with UU congregations, and other groups supporting those most in need.

District Executive Ken Brown notes, "As we have found in the past, insurance does not cover such devastation and it can take years for those affected to recover."

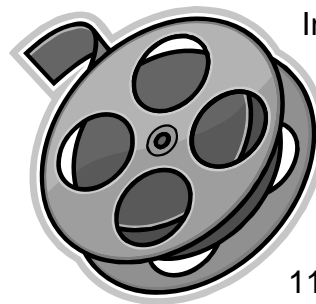

11/6/07: Impressionists: Degas (Not just ballet dancers!)

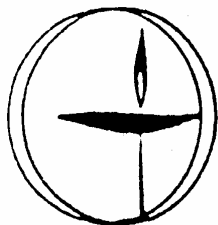
11/13/07: Impressionists: Pissaro (An eye for the French countryside!)
