Pierre-Auguste Renoir's paintings are notable for their vibrant light and saturated color, most often focusing on people in intimate and candid compositions, blending with a soft edge into their environment.

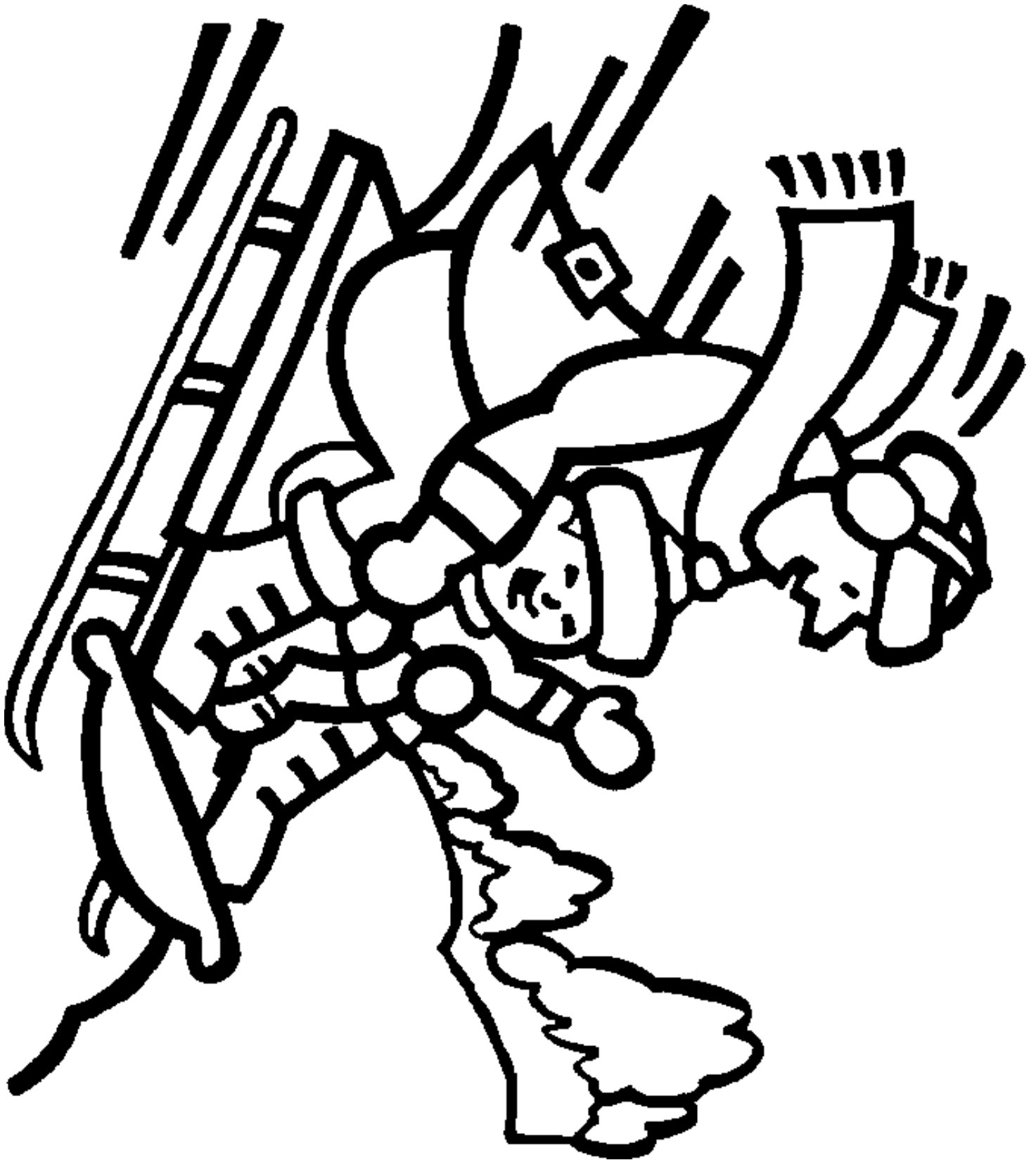
Jan. 22: *The Impressionists: Seurat.*

Jan. 29: *Hawaii.*

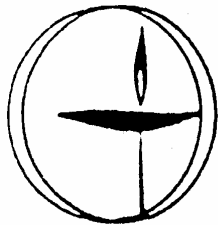
