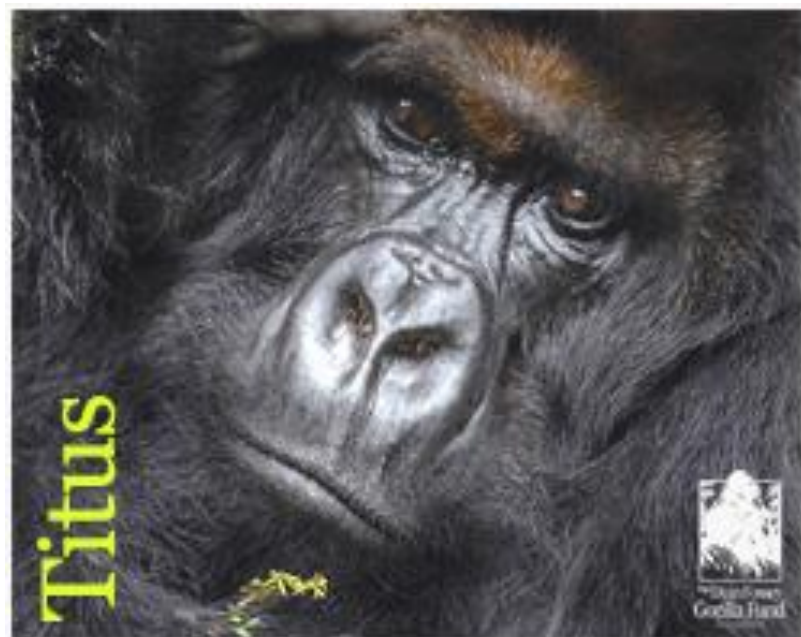
Social Justice and Community Outreach Survey

Gorilla Run

The Children's RE wants to adopt a gorilla and needs your help! In our current curriculum, Faithful Journeys, the children express their faith through their actions. We have looked at each of the UU principles and discovered ways in which we support and uphold them in our families and communities. This past winter the youth learned about the democratic process by choosing a global cause to support. Many worthy pursuits were suggested to help make our world a better place. In the end the children agreed to help protect wild mountain gorillas in Africa. We researched about this endangered species and have lots of information to share. Our goal is to adopt a mother and infant pair. To raise funds the children have agreed to participate in a Gorilla Run which will take place at our end of the year fellowship picnic on June 13. Member pledges per lap will be multiplied by the total number of laps the RE children run rather than per individual. More to come...

The Dian Fossey Gorilla Fund is dedicated to the conservation of gorillas and their habitats in Africa through anti-poaching, monitoring, research, education and support of local communities. Proceeds from adoptions directly support the gorillas monitored by the Karisoke Research Center staff.

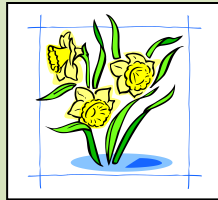
How to Garden for Wildlife

1. Grow plants that provide wildlife with a natural food source such as nuts, berries or nectar, or offer supplemental feeders.
2. Provide water for wildlife with a birdbath, small pond or shallow dish.
3. Offer protected cover for wildlife by providing a ground cover, a hollow log or rock piles, dense shrubs, or a roosting box.
4. Provide places for wildlife to raise young such as a water garden, a pond, or a nesting box.
5. Practice sustainable gardening such as mulching, composting, or reducing your lawn area.

Please watch what you plant in your garden. Exotic species not native to your region can become invasive and harmful to both people and wildlife.

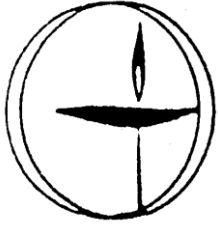
