2011 Energy Conference ***Saturday, March 31-Saturday, April 2***

Gas Drilling, Sustainability & Energy Policy: Searching for Common Ground will be presented at the Cornell Law School, Myron Taylor & Anabel Taylor Hall, Ithaca, New York from Thursday, March 31 until Saturday evening, April 2. The conference will explore the legal, scientific and business perspectives on Shale Gas Development and hydraulic fracturing ("hydrofracking"). This issue has ignited a fierce battle over energy and the environment in New York State. Eight fast-paced and interactive panels will use natural gas drilling as a lens to explore national energy policy, the global energy market and the integral role the law must play in creating energy security and ensuring a sustainable future. The conference brings together over 45 distinguished speakers from Cornell University and around the country working in law, science, business and government from all sides of the energy debate.


